

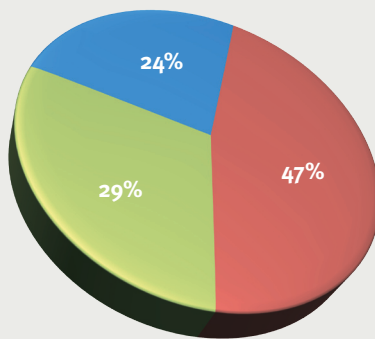
2011 INVESTMENTS IN OUR COMMUNITY

In addition to the above funds, United Way of Marion County also invests resources into the following community services:

- » Green Path (formerly Consumer Credit Counseling)
- » Success By 6, an early childhood initiative, in partnership with the Early Learning Coalition of Marion County
- » 2-1-1, a free 24-hour information and referral service for Marion County residents

Additional funding secured in the community includes:

- » \$250,474 from FEMA to programs that focus on rent, emergency food and utility assistance.
- » \$542,219 claimed in Earned Income Tax Credit to 317 of families
- » Through our Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program: 1,111 tax returns were completed bringing \$1,608,774 into Marion County for families
- » \$99,479 to 12 programs focused on meeting critical emergency needs, start-up costs, capital improvements and nonrecurring special needs in the areas of Education, Income and Health from United Way's Endowment Fund
